Sick Leave, Personal Necessity, or Personal Business...What's the difference?

Have you ever looked at the absence codes on AESOP and thought, which one do I choose? Let's take a look at the differences between sick/illness, personal necessity, and personal business.

To start with, each full-time employee is given ten (10) days per year to use. Any unused days are accumulated on an unlimited basis to future years.

So, let's start with <u>SICK/ILLNESS/INJURY</u> days. You are allowed to use any of your accumulated days for sickness. There is no limit per year. If you use up all of your accumulated days, you are entitled to compensation that is 50% of your daily rate or the difference between your daily rate and the cost of a substitute - whichever is greater, not to exceed 100 days. This is referred to as "differential pay". Please note that you may be asked to provide a doctor's note when using differential pay.

PERSONAL NECESSITY days can be used for reasons other than you being sick. A few examples are: your child is sick, bereavement beyond what is allowed by our contract, property damage that requires immediate attention, or court appearances. The full list is in our contract - article 9, section 2. For personal necessity, you are allowed to use any of your accumulated days. If you use up all of your accumulated days, and you have a personal necessity, there is no differential pay. Your paycheck will be docked each day you are out beyond your accumulated days.

<u>PERSONAL BUSINESS</u> days are for any absence that doesn't fall into the above categories. YOU ARE ONLY ALLOWED TO TAKE 10 OF THESE A YEAR. Even if you have more days accumulated in your unused bank, the maximum amount of personal days you can take per year is ten. If you use more than ten days on personal days, you will be docked - even if you have accumulated days.

Hope this explains the differences between sick, personal necessity and personal business. All of the above is in Article 9 of our contract. Our contract can be found at:
